INTRODUCING ALDERSGATE'S EMERGING VISION

Early this year, leaders from Aldersgate UMC assembled a Task Force to envision the congregation's preferred future and respond to the following questions:

- Who are we (identity)?
- Who are we called to serve?
- What is our primary purpose?
- What is God calling us to be and do, right now, as we move forward in faith?

STAGE 1: REVIEW - Describe what is

Once the Task Force was formed, it spent 5 months gathering information about the church and its local community, striving to articulate what's present, what's real, and what energizes our faith community. This involved listening to members, listening to local community leaders, and identifying the societal shifts are changing the ministry landscape in light of the "The Great Commission" (Matthew 26:16-20) and the "The Great Commandment" (Luke 10:27). In the process of reviewing the congregation's unique identity and context, the task force has affirmed the congregation's current identity statement which describes Aldersgate United Methodist Church as a Christ-centered, Jesus shaped, Spirit-led community seeking to create an atmosphere of spiritual connection, healing and growth. We are an inclusive community believing that God loves, honors, and celebrates all people regardless of age, race, nation, gender identity, background, sexual orientation, abilities, or socioeconomic position. We believe that God calls us to embody God's radical love by cultivating a space free from harassment, judgement, hate, or discrimination.

STAGE 2: RETHINK - Dream about what might be

With a clearer understanding of Aldersgate's identity and purpose, the Task Force spent 3 months rethinking and reimaging the church's mission and ministry. Guided by the identity statement and the four marks of discipleship (worship, devotion, compassion, and justice), the Task Force explored ways to make the church's future mission and ministries simple, nimble, impactful, and scalable. The desire was to streamline the structure, partner with others when appropriate, and to repurpose plans, programs, and content in ways that would reach more people at and beyond the church.

The task force embraced the Methodist process of discipleship that moves people beyond not just being learners in a classroom but rather learning a new way of being. This apprenticeship model invites people to follow Jesus, that includes "... teaching them to obey everything I have commanded...." This act of obedience is not a list of "dos and don'ts", but rather a call to be a particular kind of person and community. One way of understanding this is through the basics of the "method" that makes us Methodists, which essentially calls us to two kinds of works in this world: Works of piety and works of mercy. And it is these two works that inform our Rule of Life as Methodists, which is our General Rule of Discipleship: "To witness to Jesus Christ in the world and to follow his teachings through acts of compassion, justice, worship, and devotion under the guidance of the Holy Spirit."

Putting all four practices together (Matthew 28:16-20)

Acts of Mercy are displayed toward our fellow humans. Acts of Piety are between us and God. Justice and Worship practices are more public while acts of Compassion and Devotion are more private. The four practices describe a way of being and serve as a rule of life. Our mission as a church is to live them and call others into them. The preferred future envisioned by the Task Force was not to build a big church nor add more programs. Future initiatives would focus on bringing wholeness to the world. The activities we would create or enhance would be simple, life-giving, slow, and liberating.

STAGE 3: REINVENT - Design a map for moving forward

The Task Force began the Reinvention stage, focused on defining what our congregation needs to consistently say, do, measure, and celebrate in the future. Our emerging ministry road map lists goals, projects, and tasks we need to address this year to ensure a viable future for the congregation. Once the road map is presented to the Council and members, it will

continue to be a working document that is updated at least once a quarter. We invite church leaders and members to give feedback about the road map and to explore ways to engage members with helping fulfill its goals.

GOAL 1 | Enhance WORSHIP as an event and a way of life

Overview of the First Work of Piety: Worship (Exodus 14:26-31, 15:19-21)

Worship is central to the Christian life. But why do we do it? Who is it for? It's where we celebrate victories, heal wounds, step into God's story, and learn to follow in the way of Jesus. Worship is where the whole community comes together as one, therefore it serves as a hub for all other aspects of who we are (devotion, compassion, and justice). Worship is a means to an end, not an end itself, and that end is a kind of spiritual connection, healing, and growth that breeds disciples of Jesus.

GOAL 2 | Equip people to practice DEVOTION in their daily lives

Overview of the Second work of Piety: Devotion (Acts 2:41-36, Hebrews 10:19-25)

Devotion speaks to how we "devote" ourselves to a way of life, or rule of life, that include practices (means of grace) and accountability (a community of mutual trust and integrates personal and social holiness are. Social holiness is the ways in which we engage being together in addition to our own personal acts of piety. We invite everyone who views Aldersgate as their church home to be a part of a group of some kind, preferably a life group. This is Aldersgate's primary vehicle for helping people give and receive care, pray for one another, search the scriptures, and do acts of compassion and justice in the world.
