The Story: John 11:1-43

Context: Alright, now it's really time to buckle up. This week's story is GINORMOUS! Not only is it long, but its significance cannot be overstated. This story is Jesus resurrecting Lazarus. We have just wrapped up The Good Shepherd with Jesus saying, "The thief comes to steal, kill, and destroy, but I have come that they may have life, and have it abundantly." And what's one of the next thing he does? HE RESURRECTS SOMEONE FROM THE DEAD! He kills death.



There is a lot that happens in this resurrection, but one of the key elements to this story is that, unlike in Matthew, Mark, and Luke, this is the catalyst for the religious elite to say "enough and enough" and see to it that Jesus is arrested. Resurrecting someone from the dead is either a blasphemous carnival trick, or so beyond anything imaginable that it is too much of a threat to power. Keep that in mind.

Another thing to keep in mind is what follows this story. In John 12 we see that the Lazarus story continues. He is Devotions for Life March 6, 2022


MN Food Share Month:

hosting a meal and is reclining at the table with Jesus. Remember, this whole concept of belief and life in Jesus in John's Gospel is about intimate relationship. And that's what we see in John 12 (among other things).

Reading the Story:

There are so many angles to this story, that there's a lot to take in as you read and explore it. So be sure to pay attention to the verses, themes, and moments that strike you. Verse 2 is a curious verse because it refers to something that hasn't happened yet. Skip ahead to chapter 12 to see what this is about and to see the important continuation of this story.

Questions for Discussion & Reflection:

- What images or metaphors popped out at you in this passage? What don't you quite understand?
- How would you feel if you sent help to someone you believed could help you with something time sensitive, and they put it off for two days?
- Considering the way "day" and "night" and "light" and "dark" function in John, what is important about verse 9 and 10?
- Ever heard of "doubting Thomas?" Verse 16 is why. But can you blame him?
- Why do you think "dead in the tomb 4 days" matters?
- Why do you think Jesus says "I am the resurrection <u>and</u> the life?
- How do you understand verses 11:25-27?
- What seems to trigger Jesus emotions in this story?
- Do you see any connections in verses 38-44 to things Jesus said about The Good Shepherd and the sheep? (Think about things like names, voices, following, etc.)
- Do you believe people can be resurrected from the dead? How do you understand resurrection? Do you have doubts or questions about it? What are they?
