The Story: Joseph & His Brothers

Main idea - God can make good things out of bad

There once was a man named Jacob who had twelve sons. But of all his sons, Joseph was his favorite. Jacob wanted to show Joseph how much he loved him so he had a very special coat made for him. This coat was very colorful, and whenever Joseph wore it

all his brothers were jealous. They didn't think that it was fair that Joseph got such a beautiful coat and they got nothing.

One day Joseph had a dream, and he went to tell his brothers. He said, "Last night I had a strange dream. We were tying up bunches of grain out in the field when suddenly my bunch stood up, while all of yours gathered around and bowed to me." The brothers looked



at each other. "Who do you think you are?" The brothers said. "Do you think that you are better than all of us?" This dream made the brothers dislike Joseph even more.

It wasn't long before Joseph's brothers began to talk bad about him and plan what they could do to him because they hated him so much. One day when he came to them in the fields they grabbed him and pulled off his beautiful coat. They threw him into a

Game:

Making something good out of bad

Take a blank sheet of paper. Also, take some torn pieces of colored paper or cut out colors from catalogs or magazines. Have your child make a picture with the "bad" things by gluing the pieces into a picture. Talk about how bad situations can turn to good.

Prayer: Dear God, thank you that you can take something bad, and turn it into something good. In Jesus' name, Amen.

Story Discussion: Talk to your child about jealousy and envy. Are they envious of something one of their friends own? Do they have something that someone else could be jealous that they own? Tell your children about a time when you were jealous and what you did about it.

Joseph had vivid dreams. Ask your children if they remember any dreams. Do you think that dreams have meaning?
